Subject: SCC Releases Hearing Examiner's Report on Rappahannock Crossing--GREAT NEWS!



Neighbors and Friends:

Yesterday the SCC released Mr. Alex Skirpan's report on the Rappahannock River power line crossing. Mr. Skirpan, Senior Hearing Examiner, has recommended the line be installed *underground*. The report states:

[T]his case boils down to a determination of whether the added cost of an underground option is reasonable in light of the impact the Proposed 115 kV Overhead Route would have on the viewshed, economic development, and public safety. While the record in this case does not permit a precise estimate of the added cost of an underground option, as discussed more fully above, the likely added cost of an underground option is substantial. However, in this case I find that the Proposed 115 kV Overhead Route will significantly and negatively impact the viewshed, especially the currently uninterrupted views of the Rappahannock River and Chesapeake Bay from the Norris Bridge. Moreover, this viewshed is vital to a local economy dependent on tourism and retirees moving to the area. Closely tied to an economy

dependent on tourism and retirees moving to the area is the negative impact of the added towers and fenders may have on boating. In this case, I find that the negative impacts of the Proposed 115 kV Overhead Route outweigh the added cost of an underground option.

It is important to understand that this is *not* the final decision in this case. Mr. Skirpan's report must be reviewed by the three SCC Commissioners who will then decide the outcome. If they endorse Mr. Skirpan's recommendation, our beautiful river and bridge will continue to look like this--uncluttered by industrial transmission towers:
