



Electric customers in Lancaster County



Project Overview (Solar)




- Location: North and south from Mary Ball Road (Route 3) as well as setback from Courthouse Road and Avis Trail.
- Project Capacity:Up to 100 MW AC
- □ Acreage:
 - □ ~323 acres to be used for solar panels
- Anticipated Commercial Operations:
 2028

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Battery Storage in Virginia

- Executing the largest energy storage mandate in the nation
- Battery Storage provides the power grid with flexibility and resiliency
- Online battery storage projects include:
 - Three Lithium-ion Pilot BESS facilities located in Hanover, New Kent, and Powhatan Counties, totaling 16MWs
 - 20MW Dry Bridge BESS facility located in Chesterfield County
- Additional battery storage facilities are under development in Henrico County (Darbytown), Sussex County (Shands), and Dulles International Airport in Loudoun County, totaling 75MWs







Merry Point Battery Energy Storage System



- □ 50 MW AC battery storage facility
- Located southwest of Mary Ball Road and Merry Point Road
- □ Situated on ~10 acres of timberland
- Operational in 2029
- □ Operational life ~20 years

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Safety Protocols for Battery Energy Storage Systems



FIRE SAFETY

- Ensure Cell / Module / Unit level battery testing/certification (UL9540A)
- Minimum 25 feet spatial separation reduces the risk of a propagated fire event
- Robust layers of failure detection that may include flammable gas, smoke, and heat detection.
- Active and passive protection such as emergency ventilation and deflagration vents
- Training provided for Dominion personnel, first responders and O&M contractors on proper response protocols

BATTERY MANAGEMENT

- □ Operate batteries within safe limits
- □ Battery cells in containers during operation
- □ 24x7x365 Operational monitoring
- Proper offsite disposal of battery cells when damaged, failed or at end of useful life / site decommissioning





Project Benefits



- □ Clean Energy for Customers:
 - Diverse generation mix including solar coupled with storage; provides cleaner, more reliable power for our customers
- **Construction**:
 - Suppliers, civil construction, equipment rental, fencing, landscaping, etc.
 - Restaurants, grocery stores, gas stations
- Operations:
 - Vegetation management
 - Civil site inspection and maintenance



- Develop a stormwater plan that works with the natural contours of the land.
- □ Maintain existing buffers and vegetation that helps absorb stormwater.
- Leave natural buffers around wetlands and streams.



- Build basins to prevent sediment from entering waterways.
- □ Install adequate stormwater conveyance systems to collect stormwater and prevent erosion.
- Establish and manage vegetative groundcover throughout the project's life cycle to stabilize soil and improve soil health.
- Regular inspections are conducted to maintain the stormwater best practices.





□ Extensively screened to minimize views.

- Substantial setbacks from roads and residential structures.
- Additional screening will be added in areas where natural vegetation does not exist or is limited.
- Vegetative buffers will be maintained for the life of the facility.




